I received your first letter, but holidays, work, vacations and other activities prevented me from responding to you in a suitable manner.

In this box you will find "treasures" beyond your wildest imagination. Within it, you will find bits and pieces of my past which may fuel your future. I've enclosed almost everything you've been curious about.

As you look through the box, you will find source code (both printed and on diskette) for most of my BASIC and Assembly language games. You will find graphics charts showing how animated characters are developed. You will find "sketch" pads showing how games are conceived and turned into reality. You will find reference manuals for direct sector I/O. You will find utility disks which allow you to edit disks sector-by-sector.
