TEXNET: A WORLD OF INFORMATION

Imagine planning your family's summer vacation without the aggravation of scheduling and rescheduling airline flight reservations.

Imagine, too, getting the latest news and sports information when you want it without opening a single newspaper. Or, perhaps you'd like to imagine the simplicity of doing your shopping without leaving home, or the ability to research subjects without ever stepping into a library.

These days, with the right equipment, imagining such things is more than just daydreaming. The TI Home Computer already has the capability of revolutionizing today's systems of gathering and receiving information.

By subscribing to the TEXNETSM Information Service, users can turn their Home Computers into information centers. TEXNET brings 99/4A users the services of THE SOURCESM; a computer software

service for business, education, and home entertainment, plus access to TI news and information.

With a subscription to TEXNET, 99/4A users may have access to many useful and important information services.

Among the special services available to TEXNET subscribers, are the following:

TI NEWS—An electronic newsletter with product and technical announcements from Texas Instruments.

TI SOFTWARE EXCHANGE—Software exchange service for hundreds of free programs you can review and save with your own Home Computer.

TI VOICE CHAT—Spoken, interactive communication from other on-line users made possible by using the optional speech synthesizer.

TI PHONETIC DICTIONARY—A growing library of over 2,000 entries; offers phonetic spelling of words which are helpful when programming with the "text-to-speech" feature of the Terminal Emulator II.

TI HELP—How to use TEXNET.

TI SOFTWARE DIRECTORY—A catalog of software that can be purchased through TI dealers.

TI USERS' GROUPS—A nationwide listing of Texas Instruments Users' Groups and who to contact.

To access TEXNET, the following is required: a TI-99/4 or TI-99/4A console, Terminal Emulator II Cartridge, an RS-232 Interface Card (inserts into the Peripheral Expansion System), and a 300 baud Phone Modem. A printer is optional.

To tap TEXNET, one simply dials a local number available in more than 400 cities. A prompt from the screen then appears asking the user to type in his/her private ID account number. Once entered, the user simply enters commands using plain English.

Additional capabilities available to TEXNET subscribers include: up-to-the-minute national and international news, financial and business information, market reports, and international document research.

Travel services such as checking latest flight schedules, making airline, hotel, and auto reservations, plus gathering information about restaurants and lodging places is all a snap with TEXNET.

For an initial subscription fee of \$100 plus standard usage rates, users can have a growing world of information at their fingertips.

INSTRUCTIONAL MANUALS AVAILABLE

Texas Instruments has several instruction manuals available for TI-99/4A users of all ages.

Among those available are the following:

USER'S REFERENCE GUIDE: A comprehensive and detailed guide to the TI-99/4A Home Computer. Includes start-up instructions, tour of keyboard, and a section on 99/4A accessories. This book provides a good introduction to Home Computer uses and capabilities. Contains instruction on TI BASIC commands, program statements, color graphics, and sound. The guide is packaged with every TI-99/4A Home Computer, but may be purchased separately at a suggested retail price of \$9.95.

BEGINNER'S BASIC MANUAL: A first instruction to programming and operating the 99/4A in the TI BASIC language. This manual is included with the 99/4A Home Computer. It is a step-by-step, hands-on, learn-to-program book. Programming principles are taught. Enough instruction is provided to enable the user to write basic programs of one's own design in BASIC. The book's suggested retail price is \$9.95.

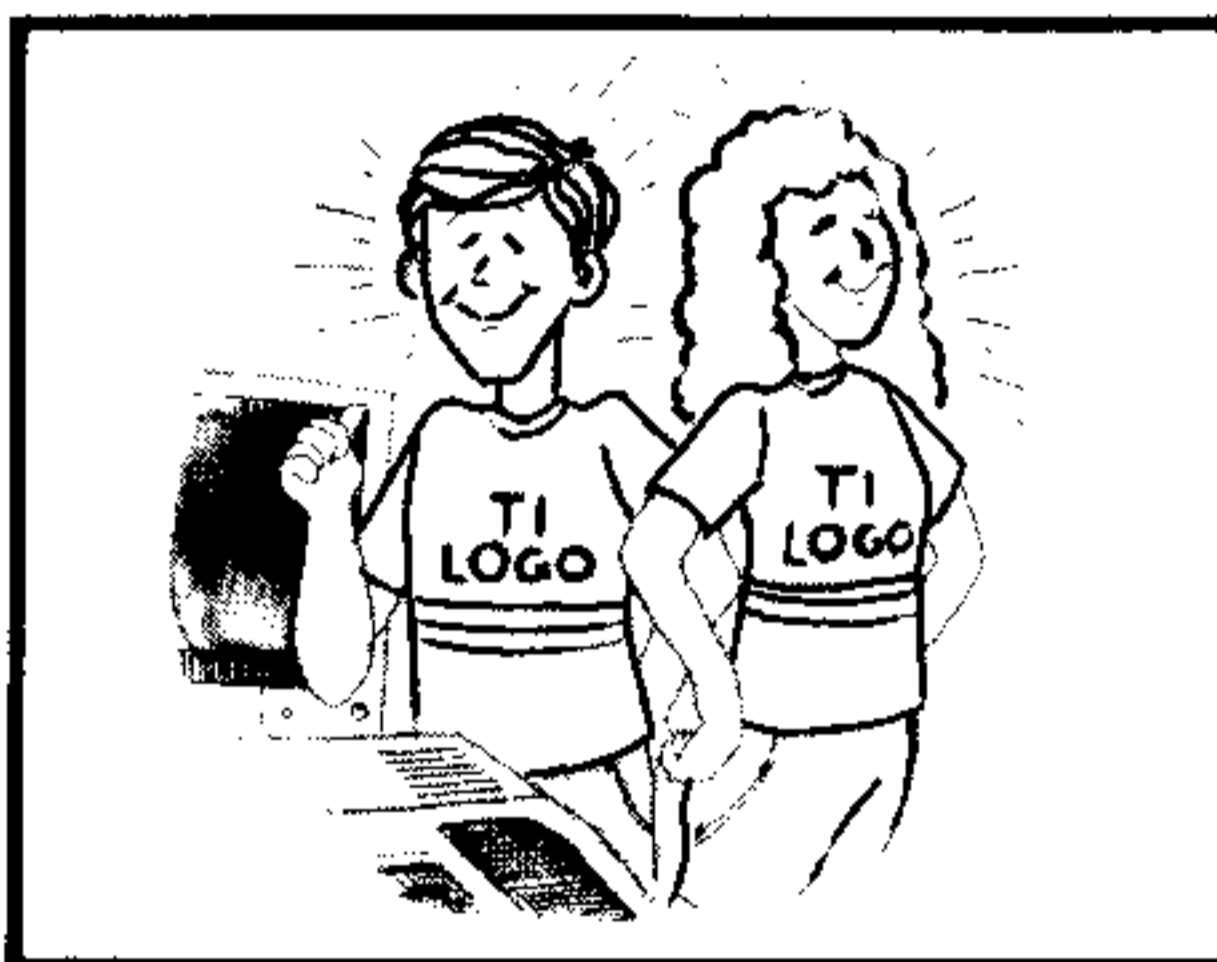
COMPUTER AWARENESS FOR ADULTS: This workbook is used by the TI Computer Advantage Club (TICAC)* adult classes. The book is designed to give the reader a basic overview of the Home Computer, its components, types of storage, tips on use of software, and a very basic introduction to programming languages and TI BASIC commands. A glossary of personal computing terms is included. The suggested retail price is \$6.95.

COMPUTER AWARENESS FOR CHILDREN: A children's activity book used in TICAC class instruction which introduces the young to the world of computers. The manual helps students gain an understanding of how computers work and what computers can and cannot do. The manual touches on computer commands and keyboard functions. A computing word

glossary is included. The suggested retail price is \$5.95.

BASIC PROGRAMMING FOR ADULTS: A compact introduction to TI BASIC programming. Statements, commands, loops, and other programming functions are discussed. Sample programs are included. The manual also contains a glossary of computing terminology. This supplemental activities book, used in TICAC instruction, will be available by May 1983. The suggested retail price is \$6.95.

PROGRAMMING DISCOVERY IN TI BASIC STUDENT GUIDE: An instructional TICAC activities manual designed to teach programming basics including writing and creating programs. The manual presents the student with an introduction to BASIC commands and statements. The suggested retail price is \$9.95.



PROGRAMMING DISCOVERY IN TI LOGO STUDENT GUIDE: TICAC student activities workbook designed to introduce children 8 and up to TI LOGO, a child-appropriate computer programming language developed by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. With LOGO, students can experiment with lines and proportions by drawing geometric figures and designs on the monitor's screen. LOGO also enables children to create animated shapes and give these shapes color, motion, and position. Users are taught LOGO commands, terminology, and programming skills. The guide is an excellent supplement to materials packaged with the TI LOGO cartridge. The suggested retail price is \$5.95.

LOGO CURRICULUM GUIDE: Manual for parents and instructors who want to teach TI LOGO to children. The LOGO curriculum guide contains appropriate activities designed to stimulate young minds. A reference guide with lengthy explanations of each LOGO command is included to help the teacher provide effective instruction. The curriculum guide comes with one diskette and one cassette. The suggested retail price is \$49.95.

THE TI-99/4A TECHNICAL DATA MANUAL: This manual contains general descriptions of the computer mainframe, I/O pin descriptions, memory and CRU allocation, electrical characteristics, 99/4A system block diagrams, and more. The book is for users who want to know more about how the console works. This book is not recommended for people lacking knowledge of computer design and operation. The suggested retail price is \$14.95.

EDITOR/ASSEMBLER MANUAL: Provides instruction on how to execute the editor and what commands to use to edit programs. Instructions for executing the assembler also are provided. Describes the syntax of the 9900 instruction set. Provides information on accessing features of the system, including high-resolution graphics, speech and sound. Also provides information on how to access sub-routines built into the console. The suggested retail price is \$14.95.

MULTIPLAN BUG UNCOVERED

A technical bug in the Microsoft™ Multiplan™ program diskette has been discovered.

The bug is triggered when some of the less-used features of the spreadsheet are used. The bug causes the screen to turn different colors in varied patterns.

One feature which triggers the effect is the External Copy command. When trying to copy several rows and columns below row 5 at one time, the problem described above occurs. To avoid this occurrence, you can make extra copies one row at a time or name the area and copy it by name.

Only a few Multiplans were released before the bug was discovered and a revised diskette manufactured. If you recently purchased your Multiplan, chances are that you bought the revised version.

CATALOG PROGRAM OFFERS CONVENIENCE

If you're like most of us, you've experienced the frustration of forgetting what file names you've used for individual files.

The program listed here catalogs a disk and offers you the convenience of being able to leave in a cartridge, Extended BASIC, for example, while you catalog a disk.

The program enables you to read and print the catalog for a diskette from TI BASIC. A single-dimension array of five items corresponding to the five types of files is set up in lines 100 through 160.

Lines 170 to 190 prompt you for the drive you are using (if you give an invalid disk drive number, the prompt will appear again).

Lines 200 to 220 read in the diskette name, usage information, and display the file on the screen.

The remainder of the program reads the file names and attributes, formats, and displays the catalog on the screen.

You can save this program on each diskette by typing in:

SAVE DSK1.CAT (Press Enter)

USER TIP: TI-WRITER

Anyone who uses the TI-WRITER Text Formatter may be familiar with the automatic form feed which occurs each time you print.

The form feed is frustrating when your document has few pages because the printer automatically advances one entire page, making that page useless.

Here is one way to prevent the form feed from advancing when you want to print just a few pages:

Leave your printer turned off until late in the Formatter activation sequence. Enter all information into the formatter as usual until you reach the question, "Pause at end of page?" The default is "No." Change this to "Yes" and Enter it. "WORKING" will appear at the bottom of your screen followed by "Press Enter to Continue." Now is the time to turn on your printer and then press Enter. Your

document will begin printing without form feeding first.

When you're ready to catalog a disk, type in:

document will begin printing without form feeding first.

It must be pointed out here that you must press Enter for each subsequent page which is why this is ideal for printing only a few pages. If you plan on printing many pages at one time the one lost sheet due to the form feed is a relatively minor problem.

TI PROGRAMMING BOOKS INTRODUCED

Beginning in May, bookstores will carry the first of a line of programming books for the family of Texas Instruments personal computer products.

"LEARN BASIC: A Guide To Programming the Texas Instruments Compact Computer 40," is the first TI programming book of its kind to be available on bookstore shelves.

This book is a practical hands-on programming manual designed for people with little or no computer experience.

CC-40 enthusiasts easily can learn to program TI's new Compact Computer with the help of the "LEARN BASIC" CC-40 programming version.

The CC-40 book is organized into 28 short, easy-to-follow lessons. Each lesson covers an important programming concept. BASIC statements and commands necessary for programming the

CC-40 are explored.

Review exercises are provided after every four or five lessons to reinforce learning. Answers to all review questions are found in a special appendix at the back of the book.

Knowledgeable programmers also will find the book useful. Sample programs are included that can be used by professionals, students, managers, hobbyists, and computer enthusiasts.

The book's author is TI writing consultant, David Thomas. Thomas has extensive experience writing about programmable products and computers.

A TI-99/2 version of "LEARN BASIC" is scheduled to follow in July.

Both versions of "LEARN BASIC" will be available in bookstores and from TI retailers at a suggested price of \$9.95.
