- 84) A simple way to check the catalog on your disk is to do the following a) When you have the files you want on the disk, use the Disk Manager and catalog your disk not to the screen, but to "DSK1.CAT". This will create a file on your disk that contains the catalog you normally see. b) When you want to check what's on the disk while in BASIC, use this four liner (it will end in an error but you can ignore it).
  - 1 OPEN #1: "DSK1.CAT"
  - 2 INPUT #1:C\$
  - 3 DISPLAY C\$
  - 4 GOTO 2
  - c) When you add or delete files from the disk be sure and repeat step a.
- 85) From the Central Texas UG comes this tip In the command mode type "your command":: ACCEPT AT(1,1):A\$ ENTER FCTN 4
  "your command" (ex CALL SCREEN(16) for a white screen) will execute and stay that way while you remain in the command mode (until an error occurs then it will return to normal).
- 86) The Pittsburgh UG passes on this tip ACCEPT AT(row,column):A\$(0+row) will allow you to input up to 255 characters rather than the normal 28. Just make sure that you do not end up on an edge character (ASCII 31).

PROGRAM NOTES

THE PROGRAM FOR THE SEPTEMBER MEETING SHOULD BE A GOOD ONE. WE HAVE BEEN WANTING TO DO A PROGRAM ABOUT BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEMS FOR QUITE A WHILE, BUT WE WERE NEVER ABLE TO FIND A TELEPHONE THAT WE COULD USE DURING A MEETING. WE HAVE FOUND A UNIQUE SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM. THE PROGRAM FOR THIS MONTH WILL BE A PRESENTATION UTILIZING VIDEO TAPE, SHOWING MANY OF THE AVAILABLE BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEMS IN THE LOCAL AREA, AS WELL AS A GLIMPSE OF SOME OF THE AVAILABLE SERVICES PROVIDED BY COMPUSERVE, THE SOURCE, AND WESTERN UNION'S EASYMAIL. FOR THOSE OF YOU WITHOUT TELEPHONE MODEMS, YOU WILL BE ABLE TO EXPERIENCE A FASCIMATING PART OF THE HOME COMPUTER HOBBY. AND FOR THOSE OF YOU WITH MODEMS, WE MAY SHOW YOU A BULLETIN BOARD OR TWO WHICH YOU HAVE MEVER ENCOUNTERED BEFORE. OF COURSE, WE WON'T BE CONNECTED 'LIVE' DURING THE MEETING, BUT WE WILL BE ABLE TO SHOW ON THE T.V. SCREEN EXACTLY WHAT YOU SEE WHEN YOU HOOK UP TO A TELEPHONE AND DIAL THE VARIOUS SYSTEMS.

WHEN WRITING A PROGRAM, IT IS USUALLY A GOOD IDEA TO WRITE THE PROGRAM ON PAPER FIRST, BEFORE TYPING IT INTO THE COMPUTER. OCCASIONALLY, I NEED A SHORT PROGRAM WHICH I CAN WRITE BY JUST TYPING IT IN. THE DIFFICULT PART OF CREATING A PROGRAM AT THE KEYBOARD IS IN KNOWING WHAT LINE NUMBERS YOU WILL BE USING IN LATER PARTS OF THE PROGRAM. ONE TRICK I USE IS TO SUBSTITUTE SEVERAL POUND SIGNS (#######) IN PLACE OF THE STATEMENT NUMBER IN A 'GO TO' STATEMENT, AND THEN EDITING THE PROGRAM LATER TO REPLACE THE ####### WITH THE CORRECT LINE NUMBER. FOR EXAMPLE, I MIGHT TYPE IN THE FOLLOWING PROGRAM SEGMENT WHICH DISPLAYS A MENU AND BRANCHES TO THE APPROPRIATE PART OF THE PROGRAM, DEPENDING ON THE RESPONSE TO THE MENU:

NOTE THAT LETTERS CAN BE ADDED TO THE STRING OF #####\*'S TO INDICATE WHERE TO GO. AFTER WRITING THE REST OF THE PROGRAM, I CAN FINISH THE PROGRAM BY LISTING THE PROGRAM ON THE SCREEN, AND LOOKING FOR THE #####'S. I USE THE POUND SIGN BECAUSE IT IS EASY TO SPOT WHEN IT APPEARS ON THE SCREEN. AFTER I REPLACE THE #####'S WITH THE CORRECT LINE NUMBERS, THE PROGRAM IS DONE. (IF I FORGET TO REPLACE ANY OF THEM, I MIGHT GET A SYNTAX ERROR.)

MULTIPLAN--THE SIG GROUP MET ON SEPT. 11TH AT BOB UTTER'S. BOB PRESENTED THE PROGRAM. HE SHOWED HOW TO GET STARTED ON THE SPREADSHEET AND DEMONSTRATED HOW TO LINK INFORMATION FROM ONE SPREAD SHEET TO ANOTHER SPREADSHEET.

MODEMS--THE SIG GROUP MET ON SEPT 13TH AT MADOONA NORDAKER'S WITH 9 MEMBERS PRESENT. JEB HAMILTON PRESENTED THE PROGRAM.
