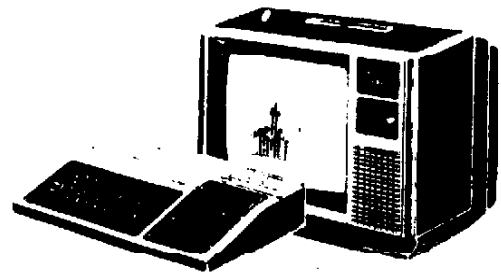


DALLAS TI HOME COMPUTER GROUP

A neat 99-9970 technique for a CALL KEY

```
100 CALL KEY(0,7,7)
110 IF E=0 THEN 120
120 ON POS("001234",KEY(7),1) GOTO 200,250,300,350,400,450
```

The program will go to line:

```
200 IF K is not 0,1,2, or 4
250 if K is 0
300 if K is 1
350 if K is 2
400 if K is 3
450 if K is 4
```

Lubbock has informed me that the problem (although minor) was a heretofore unknown bug and is being investigated.
