

When built, one can burn the ROS or even DM1000 or Disk Utilities into an Eprom for the Horizon Ramdisk, so loading the Ramdisk will be much faster and easier when the ever present glitch eats your programs. This is a column that will help us all. At the last meeting it was brought up that alot of us talk over the heads of our members. This statement led to a great meeting and alot of information sharing. I think we all gained knowledge in some areas. I would like to have this column answer some of the questions as well as a place for future reference. What I would like is to have you drop me a note at the meeting or send it to my house on what you would like to know more about. Remember keep it simple since I don't know anything about assembly programing. If I don't know the answer I will try to find one. Let me show you an example.

Ramdisk - A card that fits in the Peripheral Expansion Box and simulates a disk drive. Instead of a floppy disk, programs, information or files are stored in memory for lightning fast access. A Ramdisk can be formatted with DM1000 just like a regular disk. The Ramdisk also has a battery to keep the data in memory so you don't loose the information when the PE box is turned off. It also comes in various sizes like single, double, or what is known as triple sided. That just means it holds more data. There is also a 1 Meg Ramdisk that has 1024 sectors. Sectors are the numbers you see listed as SIZE in the many different disk manager programs.

See, isn't that simple? Not too technical. Just enough to let you know what it does and how it works. If you have suggestions for this column please feel free to ask. We will try to answer your questions in a way that all can understand. - Ken Dominiec

Some lag behind let things go, some never help thier club grow.


