## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT-JUNE 88

#### BULK DISKETTES:

SNUG still has bulk diskettes for sale. The price for a package of 12 diskettes which includes Tyvec sleeves and labels is as follows: SNUG members - \$6.00 per package or 2 Packages for \$11.50. NON-MEMBERS - \$7.00 per package. First come, first served.

#### FREEWARE Donations:

June's meeting will be your last opportunity to contribute to the FUNNELMEB and HORIZON Ramdisk J.J. Menu junds before I send the money off to Australia and Florida. Both of the authors have contributed a great deal of time and money in the development of their programs and should be rewarded for their unsaffish efforts to support the TI and Geneve communities.

#### NEW PROGRAMS:

LOGIC-GAME: John Martin gave me this challenging game at the last officers meeting. It comes from Canada and has French instructions. Briefly, from what I can figure out the object is to move the large Red block from the top to the bottom of the playing grid. Use the E,S,D,X keys to move the pointer dot over the block you want to move; press enter to change dot to a hand; use E,S,D,X again to move hand/block to the position you want; then press enter again to get the dot back. FCTN 8 will reset the grid to the original starting point. NO other keys work. It's got me

As for the 26 assorted Disks of Archivad and/or Compressed programs we got from outside sources, I've managed to cut them down to 22 disks by eliminating duplications. If I Compress the Archived files I may be able to save a few more disks. Putting EACH Decompressed/DeArchived file on a single disk will take up the equivalent of 61 seperate disks; 35 S8/SD, 26 S8/DD, and 1 D8/DD. Later some can be combined to conserve disk space.

About 60% of the programs are game and educational cartridges converted to run off of disk with a special loader program; another 20% are Special Utility programs; and the rest are Basic and Xbasic programs. Some of the programs will run off of the MINI-MEMORY and SUPER-CART cartridges. If you're interested in more information on any of these programs contact me at the June meeting where I'll have the master listings.
