DIRECTIONS: From the four corners at Paris St. and Regent St.S.; travel South on Regent St.(Hwy 69 to Toronto). Go past two sets of traffic lights (not counting those at the four corners). "OUR CLUB UPDATE"

Since our last Newsletter we have expanded on the hardware owned by our club. In addition to the X-Basic module, we now own a Computer Console with Power Supply and RF Modulator. As suggested in the last newsletter, this system will be available on a loan basis to our paid-up members, for their use while their own system is being repaired. It can also be used as a back-up computer for our meetings.

In response to the mailing of our newsletter, we have had two replies: SHER-TI CLUB in Sherbrooke, Quebec and the FREDERICTON AREA USERS GROUP. We welcome these clubs to our outside contacts and hope that our mutual exchange will prove beneficial to us all.

If you are interested in looking at a particular Module, please let Stephen know this as well. Records will be kept to show who has borrowed a Module and the date. The period of exchange can be agreed between the persons involved.

Our club continues to receive Newsletters as put out by several groups: Channel 99 (Hamilton Users Group); The Ottawa Users Group; Tigercub Software; Corcomp; Millers Graphics; to name a few. These, along with all the other information we receive, help to keep us informed and allows us to expand our knowledge. Don't forget to ask at our meetings to have a look at this information.
