TOLL FREE BULLETIN BORRDY





MINUTES

VAST COMPUTER USERS GROUP

USIING THE BBS

PART 1: AN OVERVIEW By Jim Ely, Assistant SysOp

Most of the members of VAST Know that the Group operates a neat Bulletin Board System (BBS), but only a very small percentage of the membership makes use of it. Why is that?

I believe that a big part of the problem is intimidation. Members are afraid to call because they think they will make a mistake or break something. A lot of folks also picture in their minds this gigantic machine that is too complex for them to learn how to use.

In this series of articles, I will try to take some of the mystic out of BBS usage.

What is the BBS, anyway? All it really is is a computer system, much like your own computer system, running a BBS program, connected to a telephone line, allowing a caller (user) access to its functions. You, through the phone line, control what the BBS computer does by using your computer to "talk" to it.

There is some very necessary hardware and software items required. With the TI-99/4a you need an RS232 interface card, a modem and a special cable to connect the modem to the RS232 card. The modem connects your computer to the phone line and the modem serves as a translator by which the two computers can communicate.

You will also need to run a "terminal" program on your computer. For the TI there are several fine software programs available, the most popular of which are TELCO, Mass Transfer and Fast-Term. I personally recommend TELCO because it is very straightforward and easy to use and has on-line help for most of the Key - press functions. (The VAST software Library has this program, as well as all of the others, and the documentation available.)

Once you have all of the necessary hardware and software set up, you are ready to go! AAH... another stumbling block. "I don't Know how to install, connect and configure all this stuff!"

There are quite a number of extremely Knowledgeable people in VAST who would be more than willing to help you "get it all together." Among them are Mike Grogan, Ralph Rees, Jim Ely and Tom Pfeffer, just to name a few... Give any of them a call, they're ready to help.

It is my intent to cover most of the major items users access on the BBS in these articles. The articles will assume that you have already gotten your system, hardware, software and modem configured and are ready to call and use the BBS.
