

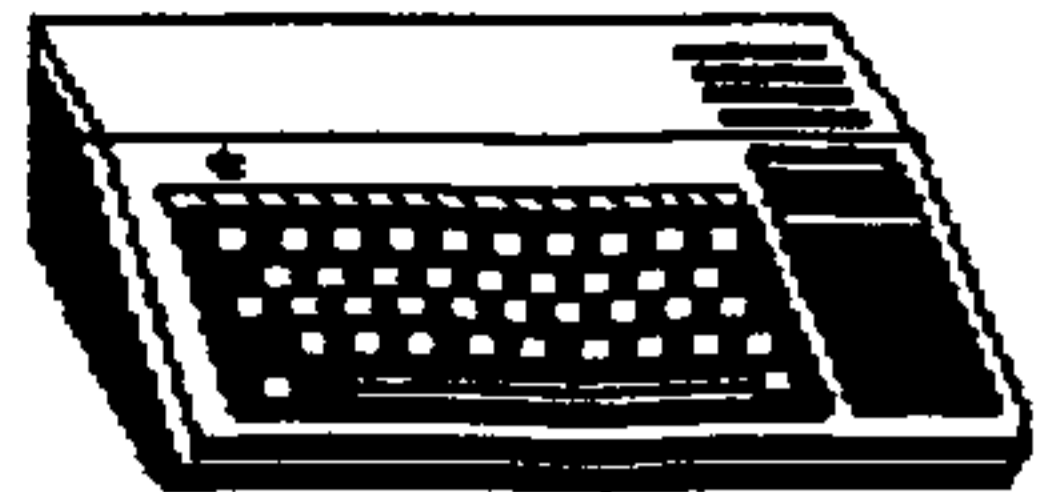

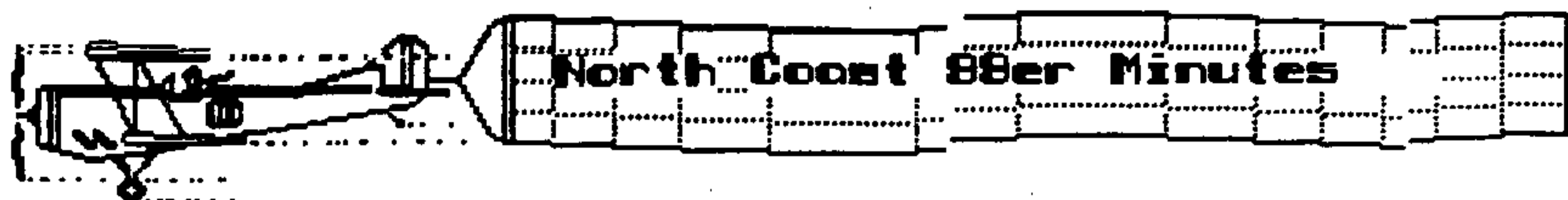

This was used by Charles Good to enhance his seminar tapes from the Lima MUG. Then, Norb had us play 'Bible Cryptograms', one of Jim Peterson's excellent programs. Several members worked together to solve a couple of the Bible quotations. You can also make your own encoded messages with this program. It is great fun and well written. Norb also demoed a commercial game written by William Reiss, called TI-PEI, which is a tile game where matching tiles are removed from the screen until you have taken them all off. Ron Markus has this game, as it is an Asgard product. We had a lot of fun playing games with Norb.

Ken adjourned the meeting and Ron got a little business as members were leaving for home.

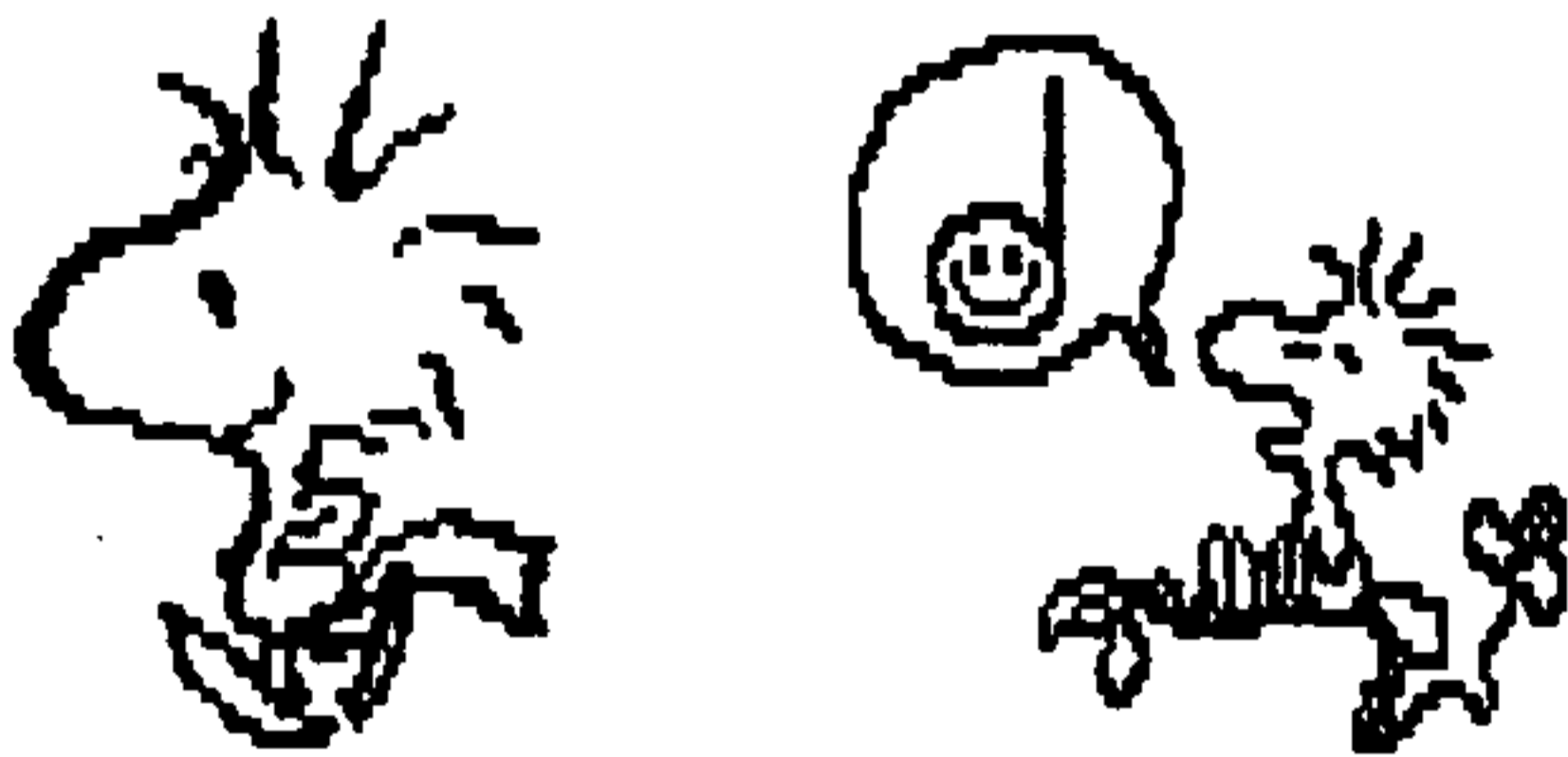

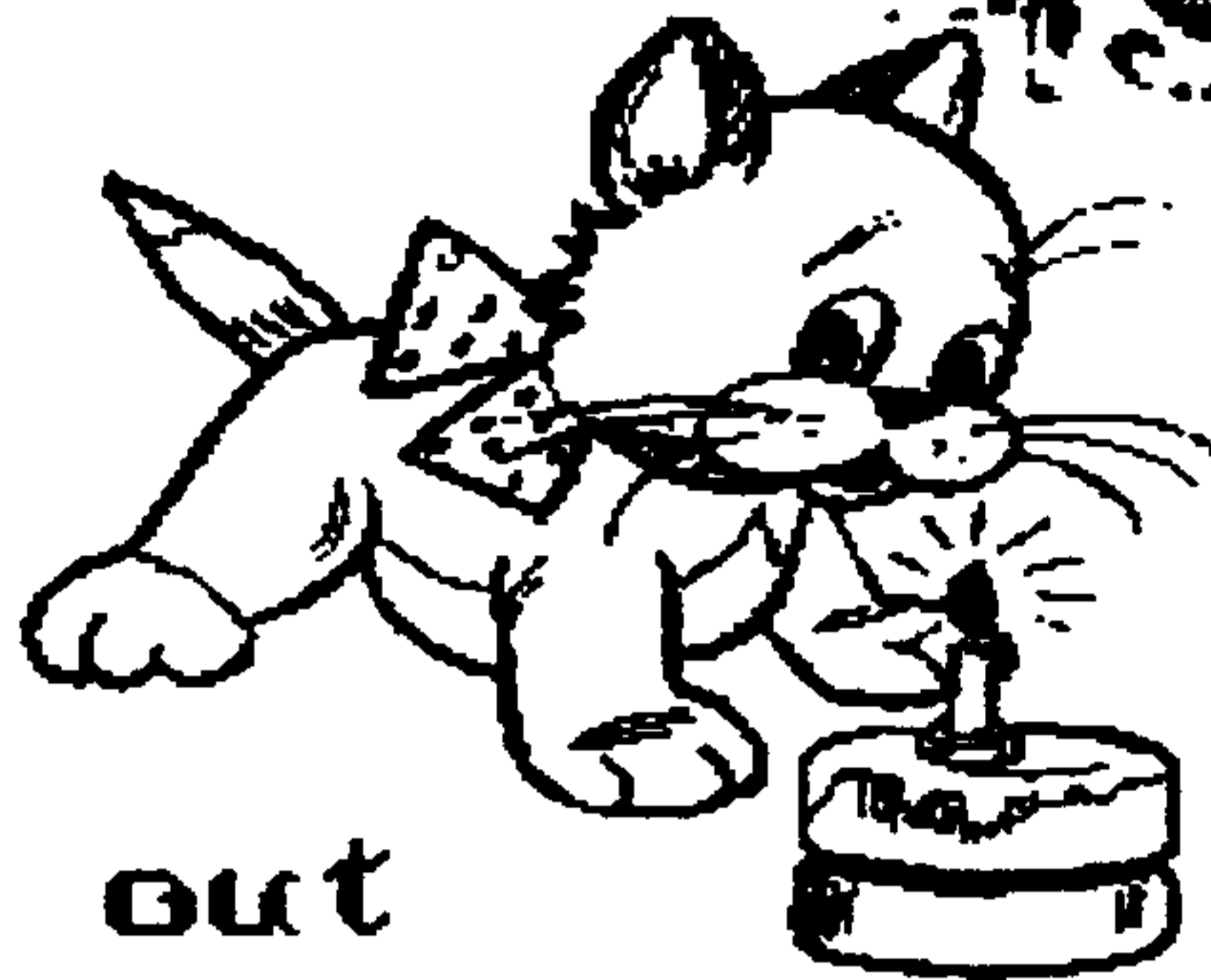

# LIBRARY UPDATE

## DISK 95051:

A collection of recipes and a couple of humor files. The catalog follows:  
2XBKDPOTAT,      APPLSQUARE,      BLACKBEAN,  
CHIC-BRSTS,      CHIC-QUIK,      ESC-SALAD,      GEESE,  
HUM1/1/5,      HUMORINDIA,      PINEAPLECKE,  
ROOTBEERCK,      SCHMITHAUS. These abbreviated names are not too easy to decipher but you get the idea. For example, ROOTBEERCK is a recipe for Root Beer Cake.

## DISK 95052:

This is an archived collection of messages by TI users to each other containing useful information and chit chat about goings on in the TI world for December 94. I downloaded these from the Internet so you can enjoy them even if you don't have a modem.

## DISK 95053:

More Internet downloads. There is a large archived file of messages from TI-ECHO for January 1995 and a shorter one from February 1995. TI-TELCO is an article originally printed in the Cleveland NL by Glen Bernasek on how to use TELCO as a telephone dialer. TI-ADDRESS is a list of E-MAIL addresses for TI users all over the world. If you have access to one of the Freenets, Internet or a commercial service you can use these to contact these people.

PHONE#PROG is a reprint of an article from the Lima newsletter which contained a program in text form. I used the CONVERTXB file to change this DV/80 file to a program which I called PHONE#. It will take any seven digit phone number and list to screen and/or printer all of the words that can be made from this number. For example, TI-CARES can be dialed on the phone. Perhaps your phone number can be expressed as a word or saying as a handy mnemonic. Take a look at this program anyway, it is an example of how a file can be converted.

## DISK 95054:

LABELMAKER is a "rerun" of an old disk which has been in our library for a long time. I am including it for the benefit of members who have joined since then and for those of you who have forgotten it. It will print labels which have a picture of your selection on the left side of the label.

There are about 100 different graphics from which to choose. You can print this on a label or on an envelope if your printer permits this and most of them do. There are a couple of disks of other graphics in the library which can be dug out if there is any interest.

## DISK 95056:

British Columbia UG newsletters for March and April 1994. These are formatted to print a handsome and informative newsletter. The April issue has a tutorial on some of the more common XB commands such as FOR and NEXT, GCHAR, GOSUB, GOTO, HCHAR, IMAE, INPUT AND INT. There are short programs to illustrate their use.
