

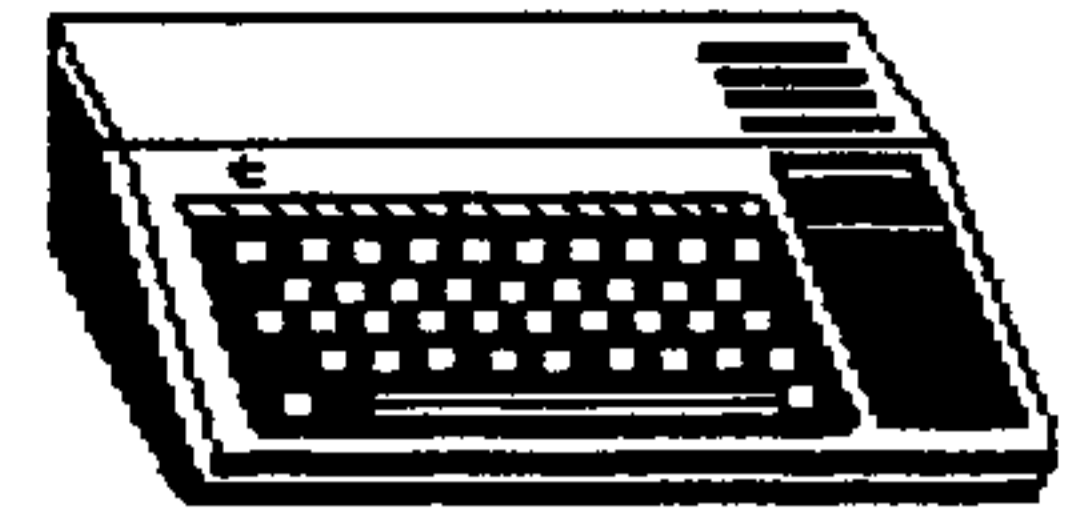

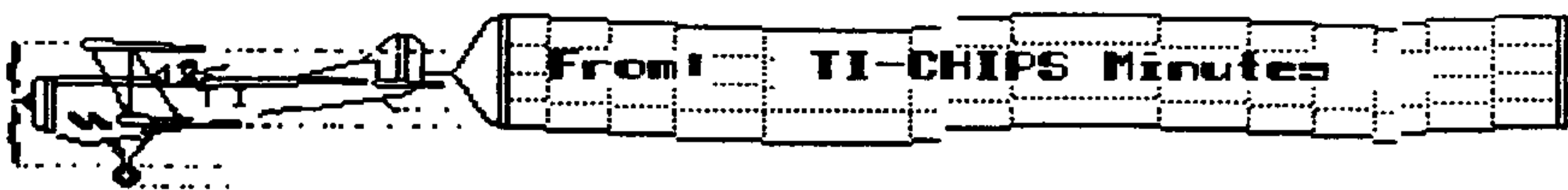

The September meeting of the TI-Chips was opened by Fred Ialacci. Reading of the August meeting minutes was waived. Our Treasurer, Lin Shaw, was unable to attend. Therefore I gave his report.

John Parken gave the membership report and stated that there were 21 paid members in the TI-Chips. John said he was working on re-entering membership data in PR Base, and he asked for input on how to organize the data base fields. It was suggested that since John has had the most experience with the membership records, that it would be all right with us what ever way John decided to organize his files.

Les Kee reported that he was able to un-arc the 1997 Lima software files and that he will be working on hard copies of a catalog of the file titles.

Ada Markus gave an excellent report on possible locations for the TIMUG'99. The report, the result of hard and dedicated work by Ada Markus, Nina Hoffman and Matt Andel, was transcribed by Ron Markus. After listening to Ada's presentation and much discussion, the Chips decided to go with Spang Mansion (near the I-X Center and Cleveland Hopkins International Airport) on an interim basis. Since we will be unable to reserve Spang Mansion until April 1st, we also elected to place St. Peter the Apostle Hall and the Old Brick Schoolhouse as alternates. This will allow the Hall Committee to continue their search. However, as of now, TIMUG'99 will be held at Spang Mansion on Karloff Drive just south of the I-X Center on Saturday, May 15, 1999. The Friday evening set-up and get-together is still to be decided.

I brought up an old subject. I said I had found a device to allow the Chips to display demonstrations from a PC onto the library's large screen T.V.. The device I found is the TView Micro by Focus, and it sells at Staples for \$99. There was a lively discussion and a motion was made and passed to authorize me to purchase the TView Micro and bring it to the next meeting. The TI-Chips will now have the ability to conduct demonstrations of both TI-99/4A and PC systems on the big screen T.V.. (This will open up a whole new world of learning and sharing for the Chips. We may have just guaranteed our survival as a user group.)

Ron Markus reported that he had tried to contact John Koloen of MICROpendium, regarding subscriptions, through the old e-mail address without success. Ron said he found that John had changed ISP servers and his new address is: JKoloen@earthlink.net. Ron said he is still waiting for a reply from John.

John Parken brought in his desktop PC and gave us an impromptu demonstration on "3D Home Architect". The 3D images of rooms being designed with the software were quite impressive for a \$21 program. Thanks for the demo John.

TI-Chips October 1998 Meeting

The October meeting of the TI-Chips was opened by Fred Ialacci. The minutes for the September meeting were read and accepted.

Lin Shaw gave his Treasurer's report. Lin paid the \$106.99 for the TView Micro that the Chips purchased to enable presentations to be made from member PC's on the library's large screen TV. Lin also reported that the club hasn't been billed for the newsletter since June. Lin said he will look into this. Proceeds from the August and September raffles were turned in to Lin at the meeting. Membership dues collected at past meetings will have to wait until our membership chairman is able to attend. John Parken, our membership chairman, was unable to attend the meeting this month.

Les Kee reported that the 1997 Lima disks, that Harry Hoffman reformatted, have all been cataloged. Les will give Harry additional disks to have reformatted in DSSD format for him to read with his TI Disk Controller Card.

Curt Gadd inquired if there was a program for the TI-99/4A that would produce line graphs. The general consensus was that the TI's character size was too large to allow line graphs. The only graphs those in attendance could remember was the vertical or horizontal bar graphs. (If anyone in the TI community knows of a line graphing routine for the TI-99/4A, please let us know.)

I read the approved, interim TIMUG'99 conference schedule. It is set as follows:

(A May 14, Friday night pre-conference get together site has not been determined at this time. And therefore has not been scheduled.)

I reported that our meeting room, at the North Royalton branch of the Cuyahoga County Library, has been reserved through August, 1999. There are some exceptions however. The meeting times for November and January will be different. Due to scheduling conflicts, the November 21, 1998 meeting will be from 12:45 to 2:45 PM and the January 16, 1999 meeting time will be from 12:00 to 2:00 PM. (I am sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, but it was either accept the time changes or lose the room for that date.)

Our 'sweep-the-corners' pre-conference meeting will be held on Sunday - May 9, 1999 from 1:00 to 3:00 PM. I e-mailed these dates and times to Harry, and Harry said he will publish the changes in the newsletter. Fred Ialacci said he would also call members and remind them of the meeting time changes.

Some PC discussion was conducted. I advised that McAfee 4.0 Virus Scan was not compatible with AOL 3.1 or AOL 4.0. Since I had replaced McAfee with Norton's Virus Scan in my Compaq, I offered my McAfee 3.1.1 to anybody at the meeting. (It's better than nothing, and this version is compatible with AOL 3.0 and 4.0.) Les Kee asked if anyone knew anything about LINUX. Les said he would like to install it in a partition of his 6 GB hard drive.

Back on the TI-99/4A, Les asked if there was a home security program written for the TI. He said Ron Markus was interested in one. I said one might have been written for the joystick port some time ago, but I wasn't certain about that.

I then demonstrated the TI-Chips' new PC/TV interface device the TView Micro by focus. I demonstrated a \$2 calendar/scheduling program I had purchased from Marc's drug store. The demonstrations went off without a hitch (for a change). The TView Micro was given to Fred Ialacci for safe keeping. Fred said he will bring it to each meeting. If Fred is unable to attend, he will get it to me to bring to the meeting.

Besides additional demonstrations of the club's TView Micro, I will bring in my new 120 meg, 3 1/2" floppy Super Disk drive by Imation. This drive not only reads and writes 120 megabytes to a special 3 1/2" floppy, it also reads and writes a standard 1.44 meg 3 1/2" floppy. Les Kee said he will also bring in his laptop to do a demonstration. (The TI-Chips is up and running again!)

>How about a constructive project here. Only the Geneve can support 1.44m floppies. I hereby suggest a way to give the TI 1.44m floppy support. It is known that the eeprom does not have room for the high density routines. Well, how about deleting the low density routines and ONLY supporting the 1.44m floppy in the HFDC eeprom. You could still use another floppy controller for the double and single density routines. (A myarc FDC with an 80 track eeprom would be a perfect match.) Just set the HFDC to respond at >1000 CRU and off you go!

>I'll even make it easier - I have the source code to the HFDC eeprom, and the Mechatronic eepromer, Ask me for the source code, I'll send it to you in the format of your choice. Send it back to me with the 1.44m routines, I'll test it out and make the Eeproms available at cost to the TI world.

>How's that for a noble project. Any takers?

Tony,
The HFDC EPROM should have room for the routines; however, finding source code which matches currently known GOOD DSRs is difficult to find.

I have source to what appears to be version 12. I also have a message regarding a bug in the DSR, which was fixed, and subsequently a version 13 was perhaps available. I have not seen this version, and I know that there are problems with H12. This leaves H11 (version 11) as the most desirable.

To support 1.44MB you must:

1. Replace the 9216 with a 9216B, rated at 500Mbit/s

2. Modify key places in the code to divide/multiply the 3-bytes in the FDR relevant to AU size, file length.

3. Distribute the 1.44 format program (I forget its name) or update NDM5, to which I also have source code, though it has been some time since I tried to reassemble it.

Oh... when I said there is room in the DSR, I did not mention it might have to be at the expense of other code. Perhaps the clock code? I have not counted bytes in H11 nor H12.... but the code for High density is fairly simple and consumes few bytes of code.

I had wanted to implement the Quad density / High Density in the HORIZON RAMdisk ROS some time ago, but again, the latest version I have of the ROS source is 8.12, not 8.14.....

Subject: TI99: Latest SCSI Update as of 10/1/98

Hello all... Here is the latest information on the SCSI card updates.

As of early september, Michael Becker finished the Revision G changes and turned them over to me for testing. I have been working on compiling and testing them on the Geneve and TI and expect to be able to ship BETA units to a handfull of testers within the week.

After Michael finished the rev G fixes, he went on to try to integrate them into the earlier boards, for increased speed and stability. Unfortunately the design will not fit easily into the old revision, so he is testing the design of a daughterboard that will correct ALL errors on the earlier boards and speed things up as well! We are expecting this testing to be complete sometime in the next 2 months. It will take some extra time, especially since he must make a daughter board.

For those of you who have earlier revision boards that are having problems, once all the existing Rev G boards have been returned to customers (I have 8 at this point), I will offer an exchange for the old board for a new board, ONLY IF YOU ARE HAVING PROBLEMS with the board AND latest DSR. I only have a limited amount of G boards available, and cannot replace all of the existing old boards. MANY, the vast majority in fact, of old board users are not having any difficulties with these boards.

Once the daughterboard is made available, I will offer it as a free upgrade to all of the existing board owners, with the exception of shipping fees to WHT.

The layout and the manufacturing will need a few weeks, but this was the best solution for the timing problem. Otherwise you will have more additional jumper-wires on the backside of the board than real copper-wires.....(grin)

On hand to witness at least part of the experience was Norb Sitter, another intrepid TI'er, who obviously was having a good time at the sale.

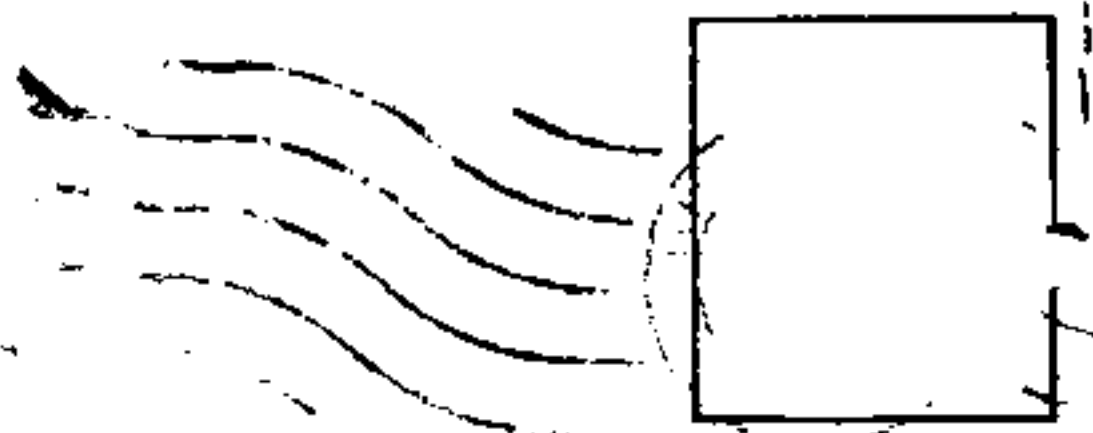
