We received a short letter from Charles Roberts, president of Excelter. that they advising us would he producing EXTENDED BASIC using TI parts. Excelted is quoting a group purchase price of \$79.95 for five or more modules. I personally feel that price is too high, since B J Sales (AKA Bob Wallace) is currently selling TI Extended Basic for \$85.00. In the future, Bob hopes to be able to get Excelted's Extended Basic at a lower price.

There will be no MULTIPLAN meeting in December. We will resume in January.

TIPS FOR MULTIPLAN BEGINNERS

Here are a few hints for people who are starting to use MULTIPLAN. You should make a copy of your MULTIFLAN and use the copy as your master disk disk. You can use the Disk Manager to make the copy, but the disk must have the name 'TIMF'. This disk should be kept in drive 1 if you have two drives. If you have two drives. 2 your data disk drive hν make " O" entering 'T' for transfer then for options. From this screen tab to the 'setup:' field and enter "DSK2'. The system will automatically go to drive 2 for loads and saves. Also, the default is to recalculate This is everytime a cell is entered. time consuming and gets more so the more info you put in the spreadsheet. Turn this off by going to option screen by entering 'O' and then press the space bar to change the recald option from "Yes" to "No" and then The spreadsheet will be press enter. recalculated only if " FCTN 87 is 1 f save pressed or you your spreadsheet. MULTIFLAN will not save a spreadsheet unless it has been recalculated.

Following is a program from Craig Miller of Millers Graphics that is a BASIC program that allows one to save and load the Mini Memory RAM to and from disk. This program saves and loads an entire 4K so one can use it with one of the third party

assemblers to write 4K assembly It does, however, programs. require CorComp's 9900 Disk Controller since it uses some of the new commands and programming statements that are built into the card's DSR ROM. 1 REM The following program requires the CorComp Disk Controller Card.
