...maybe by next month I'll have found a large font that I even like a little bit better.

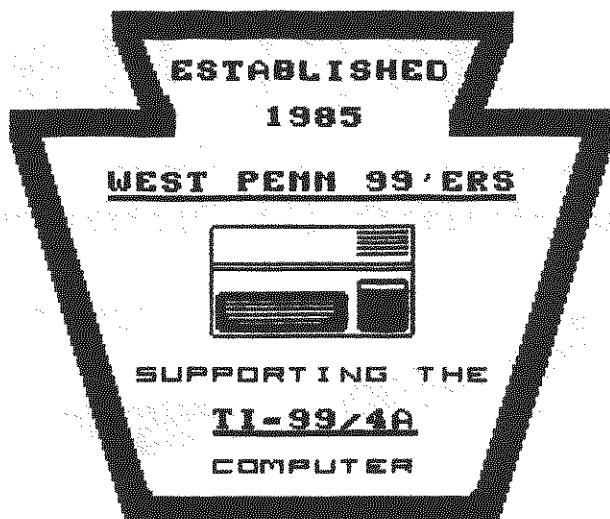
In the mean time, let me know what you think about this issues fonts.

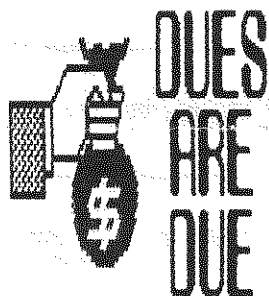

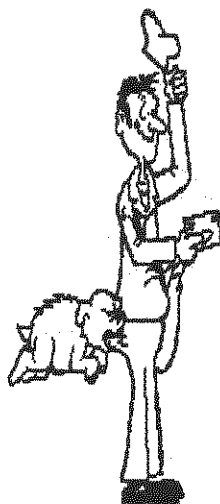

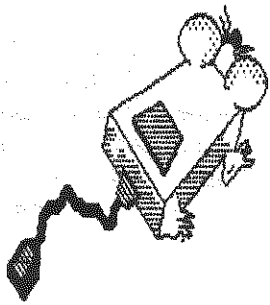
In addition, NO EQUIPMENT will be passed on until you have fulfilled your part of the bargain by giving me your newsletter articles.

...it's nice to know that sometimes dreams really do come true...

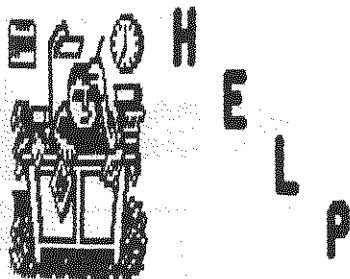
...and sometimes we actually get what we've already paid for.

What is the cause of this problem...

...and is there a better and quicker solution.

My guess is that the problem must be a combination-type problem, such as...

...using a certain copying program with a particular disk controller card when the disk is initially copied...

...however, that is just my personal guess.

Can anyone out there shed some light on this problem that I am experiencing.

By the way, I did bring this problem up at our last user group meeting on May 23rd, but unfortunately no one knew the answer to my question.

However, in doing so, I did find out that others have also experienced similar problems - so I am quite sure that this problem is not just something that is happening only to me.

Again, any help in this matter, would greatly help me, as well as others in the TI Community.

About six months ago, I purchased a used 40 Meg hard drive, along with a Myarc hard and floppy disk controller card.

Up until then, I had been using a TI disk controller card in my system.

The problem that I am now incurring is that my new setup (the one with the 40 Meg hard drive and Myarc hard and floppy disk controller card) is now saying that many of my disks are not formatted - when they actually are.

(The program that I am using now that is telling me that my disks are not formatted is NDM V).

The solution has been to recopy these disks, using my husband's system.

To do this I use his Cor-Comp controller card and the Disk Manager II cartridge.

Since this problem is occurring with about 30 percent of my 1300 disk library - this solution is a royal pain in the butt, but it is the only thing that I can do at this time.

My question is...

AN EXTENDED BASIC HINT

You have probably seen two familiar buzz words in programming manuals:

organization and structure.

Along those same lines, I have started improving my Extended BASIC programs' internal sequencing.

After my program is debugged, I save it in MERGE format, then load it using the MERGE command (instead of OLD) and then do a normal SAVE.

This puts all the instructions in the correct sequence internally instead of the scrambled sequence that results from changes made during the debugging process.

It obviously will speed up the operation of a program each time it runs.

HORIZON RAMDISK TIP

Pittsburgh Users Group

Here are the symptoms...

Your Horizon RAMdisk locks up and won't access even the physical drives (DSKx).

The system will seem to work, but the disk controller light (LEDs) will be on.

Turning the console off and on doesn't seem to work.

Here is what to do...

Plug the Editor/Assembler module into the console. Turn the PEB and the console off. Then turn the console on first.

That's right, first.

Then turn the PEB on while holding down the shift key. Select option 5 from the E/A menu and load DSKx.CFG to configure your system.

Strangely enough, the disk access reappears. The RAM-disk directories are still intact, as well as their contents.

Next, reload the ROS you usually use. Do not throw out the existing information. Exit CFG and everything will be fine.

Note: This may not work for everyone, but it's certainly worth the try!
