Page Pro 99 Modification For 24-Pin Printers

After reading Ron Warfield's Artist Cardshop Tip for 24-pin printers (reprinted on page 7 of our newsletter), I got to wondering if the same procedure might hold true for Page Pro 99 and 24-pin printers.

Well... wonder no more... cause I'm here to tell you that it does.

So . . .

If you are using Page Pro 99 and wish to print your pages out with your 24-pin printer, this is what you do.

First, make a backup copy of your Page Pro 99 disk.

Then, working with your backup copy, sector edit your disk, searching for the string, 184108 and change it to 183314.

That's all there is to it!

Your Page Pro 99 page should now print out correctly, without printing one page out at one and one third pages, and without the venetian blind effect.

Thanks, Ron, for giving me the idea of trying this.

Now.

Can anyone out there shed some light on how we can get Page Pro Composer to work with our 24-pin printers?

I tried using the same procedure as with Page Pro 99, but was not successful.

Perhaps someone reading this article could help.

NEW SOFTWARE

Rumor has it that Nickey

Cendrowski is currently working on a new disk utility package for the II-99/4A that will be "Mouse Driven" and "Window Sensitive."

Although it is too early to release any of the specific details of this package, we do know that the name of this new program will be MOUSEWORKS, and it will be released to the II Community as FAIRWARE.

Mickey states that she expects this program to be like Funnelueb - DNLY to the extent that the program will see many working revisions, as more and more features are added to the program at the request of its users.

Release date of Version 1.0 is expected to be at the II New England Fair on September 30th, with backup release dates set for the Chicago show on October 28th, and Fest West '96 on February 17th.

An article seems to be very hard to come by these days. I am sitting in front of my trusty II trying to think of what I could write about. I have a lot of software and the only thing that I really use a lot is Page Pro 99. Since Mickey is using Page Pro 99 to do the newsletter, I thought that this is where I would start.

BOOKS are taking up more and more room in my computer room, or should I say my bedroom. I moved to a smaller apartment and I am pushing the walls. I am having a hard time finding things, or remembering what goes where. So one of the things that I must do is to get organized. To help the Page Pro 99 users, I will write about a few things that I picked up on in using Page Pro

The muscles of the program is in trying to remember everything. I get so involved that I lose concentration and mess up. When I want to put a picture on the screen to see what it looks like, I press CTRL O and the Picture appears (and disappears). At the bottom of the screen is the information of where you are at CLINE and COLUMN). The P in the middle means that the Picture is turned on. The * means that the Picture is turned off. I use this when I don't know what I am doing. It is hard to type with the Pictures turned on, since leaving the screen and coming back will pause the process until the Pictures are loaded into place. So sometimes looking at the bottom is helpful.

The arrow keys are very helpful. If you wish to clear a large area, just press CTRL 9 (large font) CTRL (arrow keys) and the pointer at the bottom right will indicate the direction you are going. Then just press the space bar. This is handy when I want to erase the line fonts or large chunks.

Ising Page Pro 99 is similar to using Funnelueb when typing, as most of the keys are the same. If you are on line 66 at the bottom, press FCIN X and you will go to line number 1. If you are on line 1 at the top, press FCTN E and you will go to line number 66.

Thumbs up for Page Pro 99 - a quick page with I graphics to put anywhere you want.

A MOUSE



IN MICKEY'S HOUSE?

PART 2

Now that I am the proud owner of a Horizon Mouse, I thought that I might relay some of my experiences with you.

So far I have ONLY TRIED to use my Horizon Mouse with two pieces of software – and my Horizon Mouse has performed flawlessly.

The first of those two programs is TI-Pei, a tile solitaire game written by William Reiss and distributed by Asgard Software (available from RamCharged Computers, P.O. Box 81532, Cleveland, Ohio 44181, 800-669-1214).

At start-up TI-Pei will autoload out of Drive #1 in Extended Basic.

At the main title screen, press the space bar to

begin.

Next the screen will display the message - INITIAL-IZING.

This will be followed by the games main menu.

TI-PEI MAIN MENU

- R) REPLAY LAST GAME
- P) PLAY NEW GAME
- L) LOAD NEW SETUP
- C) CHANGE INPUT DEVICE
- D) RESTORE DEFAULT SETUP
- DI NEGIUNE DEI NI NUTT
- Q) QUIT

KEYBOARO ENABLED

To play this game using your Horizon Mouse...

Select C) CHANGE INPUT DE-UICE.

This will change the bottom message on your screen from KEYBORRD ENABLED to ASGARD MOUSE ENABLED.

Next, select P) PLAY NEW

After a brief pause, the game will appear on your screen (ready to be played with your Horizon Mouse).

You may press either the right or left buttons to toggle between selecting and de-selecting the game tiles.

To "cheat" and see all of the possible moves at any given time during the game, press the middle button.

(Again, this button works as a toggle).

To quit the game, HOLD DOWN THE FCTN 9 KEYS AND HOLD DOWN THE MIDDLE BUILDN.

The screen will go into "cheat" mode - then return you to the main menu.

The second of those two programs that I have used my Horizon Mouse with is Page Pro Composer, written by Chris Bobbitt and distributed by Asgard Software (available from RamCharged Computers, P.O. Box 81532, Cleveland, Ohio 44181, 800-669-1214).

At start-up Page Pro Composer will autoload out of Drive #1 in Extended Basic.

At the main title screen, press any key to begin.

Next the screen will display the message - Configure program? (Y/N). Answer Y.

This will be followed by the programs configure options list:

Input Device:

- (1) Nyarc Mouse
- (2) Joystick
- (3) Asgard Mouse

Press 3 to select the Asgard Mouse option.

Next, enter your printer device name. (For most of you this will be PIO.CR).

Next, you will be asked to enter your default drive/ path. (For most of you this will be DSK2.). Next, you will be asked if everything is OK. Press Y if it is or N if you need to repeat the configure process.

Your default data will now be written to disk, and after a short pause, the heart of the Page Pro Composer program will load.

Once loaded, you will be quite pleased with the responsiveness of your mouse with this program.

As a matter-of-fact I would highly recommend the use of the Horizon Mouse to anyone who uses the Page Pro Composer program.

Once you've used a Horizon Mouse with this program, you'll never want to use your joystick ever again!

NOTE: Throughout this article I've always referred to the use of the Horizon Mouse, that is because I own a Horizon Mouse and not an Asgard Mouse.

Whenever a program asks if you have an Asgard Mouse, your Horizon Mouse should work without any problem.

Mike Maksimik wrote both the Asgard Nouse routines and the Horizon Mouse routines.

About six months ago, I purchased a used 40 Meg hard drive, along with a Myarc hard and floppy disk controller card.

Up until then, I had been using a II disk controller card in my system.

The problem that I am now incurring is that my new setup (the one with the 40 Meg hard drive and Myarc hard and floppy disk controller card) is now saying that many of my disks are not formatted - when they actually are.

(The program that I am using now that is telling me that my disks are not formatted is MDM V).

The solution has been to recopy these disks, using my husband's system.

To do this I use his Cor-Comp controller card and the Disk Manager II cartridge.

Since this problem is occurring with about 30 percent of my 1300 disk library - this solution is a royal pain in the butt, but it is the only thing that I can do at this time.

My question is...

What is the cause of this problem...

...and is there a better and quicker solution.

My guess is that the problem must be a combinationtype problem, such as...

...using a certain copying program with a particular disk controller card when the disk is initially copied...

...however, that is just my personal guess.

Can anyone out there shed some light on this problem that I am experiencing.

By the way, I did bring this problem up at our user group meeting on May 23rd, but unfortunately no one knew the answer to my question.

However, in doing so, I did find out that others have also experienced similar problems - so I am quite sure that this problem is not just something that is happening only to me.

Again, any help in this matter, would greatly help me, as well as others in the II Community.

IN RESPONSE TO YOUR PLEA

Dear Mickey,

I have 2 HFDC cards and 1 FDC by Myarc and have also had the problems that you described.

The problem is that the Myarc controllers have difficulty reading CorComp disks.

CorComp controllers put the disk information at the very top of the read sector and II and Myarc leave space at the top.

II had no problems with this because they are slow, but Myarc controllers are so fast that they miss this info.

All I do is "REDISK" - copy the disk on a TI system and the problem goes away.

GOT A HINT OR TIP--THEN WHY NOT SHARE IT

ARTIST CARDSHOP TIP

I use Artist Cardshop a few times during the year and enjoy it very much.

After I got my 24 pin printer I noticed that the cards are now much longer than they used to be.

To fix the problem I used a sector editor to search for the printer codes to see what they were set at.

I found the codes were for 8/72 line feeds on an Epson printer.

Well when you have a 24 pin printer the same code sets the printer to 8/60 line feeds, hence, the longer picture.

Well to convert this to a better line feed you have to find something a little closer to 8/72 only in 180th or 360th line feeds.

Well 20/180 is almost perfect, so I changed the codes and it now works perfectly.

To do this, first make a backup copy of your Artist Cardshop disk.

Then, working with your backup copy, sector edit the file PRINTU, search for the string 184108 and change it to 183314.


