

## ORDERING INFORMATION

Those in the US should send a blank disk, and a self-addressed, stamped mailer. Foreign users need not send these, but should send bigger donation to cover expenses. I can produce SSSD format only. Those wanting other formats should send donations large enough to cover cost of buying the hardware to produce it. Fairware donations can accompany order or may be sent after inspection of program.

If you can afford \$20, it would be appreciated.

## FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS WITH FILES

Computers are great for rote memorization drill and few things require rote memory like development of a vocabulary in a foreign language. No other computer lends itself as well as the TI-99/4A to creating letters like é and ñ and most foreign languages have at least a few special letters. A good foreign vocabulary drill would allow you to add new vocabulary lists as you progress. Unless otherwise noted, each of these programs (1) let's you type in new vocabulary lists, (2) save those lists, (3) load those lists, (4) join those lists, (5) edit and correct those lists, (6) delete items from those lists. Each lets you see the documents from the program. Each can create true/false drills or multiple choice drills. The multiple choice drills can be tailored to the user's taste and ability. The drills provide graphic and musical rewards. Each disk comes with at least one large or two small starter vocabulary files for that language. Some have many more. All have room for your own files, though.

<sup>1</sup> Separate programs perform each function (edit, join, print, etc.); other languages are integrated into one main program. Operates differently than others listed but capabilities are similar.

<sup>2</sup> Unique system also: not as "integrated". Shows either kana (katakana/hiragana). No true/false. Contains alternate program for TE-II+SS that speaks Japanese (also shows it). Same files may be used by both programs.

<sup>3</sup> Latin still has no music and graphics reward sequence. Ideas requested. Uses no Arabic numerals --- exclusively uses Roman numerals!

<sup>4</sup> Japanese written with Latin alphabet.

## USER GROUPS

In creating a filing system, it is my hope that users will create their own files and share them with others. Eventually, I would like to find a volunteer to coordinate the users for each language and become the focal point for exchange of files. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the author. ### FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS WITHOUT FILES

- LNFO1 - RUSSIAN01 - Good starter for those unfamiliar with Cyrillic letters. Has some vocabulary built in. Also has bilingual (Russian/English) sing-a-long.
- LFNO2 - CZECHO2 - 4 Czech vocabulary drills that can be put on cassette and loaded on "bare-bones" machine.
- JPO1 - INTRODUCTION TO JAPANESE - Recommended before JPO2 (Kana Filer) for those with no background in Japanese. Documents explain more about the language than about the program. Also makes Romanized Japanese drills on printer.

### OTHER LANGUAGES

The following languages will be released soon if interest is expressed: ARMENIAN, ESPERANTO, GAELIC, GEORGIAN, UKRANIAN, and YIDDISH.

The following languages may be developed if enough interest exists: KOREAN, CHINESE.

The following would be developed if I can brainstorm some solutions to major problems and if enough interest exists: HINDI, other languages of India, languages of Southeast Asia other than Vietnamese, ARABIC, AMHARIC.

If you are interested in a language not mentioned and really want it, please ask!

### STYLE A

Eleven languages were programmed in a different format, now called Style A. It has been discontinued except on special request. Registered owners may have a free copy of the Style C now being offered. Any files created in Style A will be converted to Style C files by the author. No charge for registered owners.

## OTHER EDUCATIONAL FAIRWARE

- ED01 - MISC.EDUC.01 - 3 geography (JOYST/AMER, MCSTCAPS, and WORLDMILES), 3 history (AMERPRES, ENGMONARCH, GREEKROMAN), 1 astronomy demo (SOLARSYSTM), and 5 math programs (AUDIOMATH, FACTORING, GAGGLES, TRIANGE, and WORDMATH).
- ED02 - MISC.EDUC.02 - 7 geography (BIGCITY, MAPEUROPE, MAPLATINAM, NAMECITY, USMILEAGE, WORLDCAPMC), 5 math programs (CHINNUMB, MOREORLESS, PATTERNS, ROMANNUMB, TARDIS), 1 game (MIRROR).
- ED03 - MISC.EDUC.03 - 2 geography (CANADACAPS, MEXICOCAPS), SEMAPHORE, COMPOSERS, TUNESIGNAL, 1 chemistry (ELEMENTS), 1 geology (GEOLOGY), 1 philosophy (PHILOSQUOT), 1 grammar (SUBJ/VERB), FLAGS, JULY4.
- COMMONWEALTH - Collection from ED01, ED02, and ED03 skipping US geography and history. Designed for TI users outside US, esp. in British Commonwealth.
- ED04 - INVENTIONS - has 450 inventions, includes inventor and dates. Docs explain how program was written.

### COMING SOON

- ED05 - AIRTAXI - Geography GAME with more game value. Each copy will be a unique version starting at the users hometown!
- ED06 - SPEECH - Collection of fairware for use with TE-II and Speech Synthesizer.
- LNFO3 - SPANISH GRAMMAR - Drills like subject/verb agreement, adjective/noun agreement, etc.
- (FUTURE:) versions of AIRTAXI for other continents.

### COMING SOON - MORE JAPANESE

- JP 04 - KANJI FILER. This would allow filing of Kanji and would otherwise operate like Kanji program on JP01. Could be used by students of Chinese, too.
- JP 05 - STROKE ORDER. This would be in the LOGO language and would show the stroke order and not just the finished character.
- JP 06 - BARE BONES. Being developed in conjunction with Jim Peterson of Tigercub. Would take files created by JPO2 and turn them into data to be merged into shell, creating programs that don't require disk drive.
