Place PLATO diskette in the disk drive. Then, press ENTER to continue.

Slide the PLATO Interpreter Solid State Cartridge into the slot on the console.



With the PLATO Interpreter cartridge, you can:

- Begin using the Basic Skills Survey
 Diskettes and Parent's Questionnaire
 to select the packages your child
 needs in Mathematics, Reading, and
 Grammar.
- Begin using the PLATO courseware packages of your choice by referring to each courseware manual for information and guidance in getting started.

Guidelines for Success

- Be sure the cartridge is free of static electricity before inserting it into the computer (See "Caring for the PLATO" Diskette and Cartridge.")
- To remove the cartridge, first return the computer to the master title screen by pressing QUIT. Then remove the cartridge from the slot. If you have any problem inserting the cartridge, or if it is removed from the slot while in use, please see "In Case of Difficulty."
- An error message appears if the TI
 Disk Memory System and Memory
 Expansion unit are not attached
 properly. In case of difficulty, see the
 manuals packaged with your TI Disk
 Memory System and Memory
 Expansion unit.
- An automatic reset feature is built into the computer. When a cartridge is inserted into the console, the computer returns to the master title screen. All data and program material you have entered are erased.

The Survey Diskettes and accompanying Parent's Questionnaire can help you decide which Basic Skills PLATO courseware packages your child needs. Survey sessions are recorded on each side of PLATO Survey Diskettes. (See the back of the

diskette sleeve for information about inserting a diskette.)

To Use the Survey on Side 1

- 1. If you have an external disk drive, place the PLATO Survey Diskette in the drive with the label for Side 1 facing up. If you have a Peripheral Expansion System with an internal disk drive, place the PLATO Survey Diskette in the drive with the label for Side 1 facing right.
- Press ENTER to go to the PLATO Survey Diskette screen.
- Follow the screen directions.

To Continue the Survey on Side 2

- Press QUIT to return to the TI-99/4A master title screen.
- Remove the diskette from the disk drive.
- Turn the diskette to Side 2 and follow the screen directions.

To Change a Diskette During a Survey Session

- Press QUIT to return to the TI-99/4A master title screen.
- Remove the diskette from the disk drive.
- Leave the PLATO Interpreter cartridge in the console slot.
- Press any key to make the PLATO title screen appear.
- Insert the diskette of your choice in the disk drive and press ENTER to go to the package title screen.

To End a Survey Session

- Press QUIT to return to the TI-99/4A master title screen.
- Remove the diskette from the disk drive.
- Remove the PLATO Interpreter cartridge from the console slot.

To use the Parent's Questionnaire to evaluate your child's skills, first choose one of the Basic Skills
Surveys in Mathematics, Reading, or Grammar. Then, locate the corresponding questions and score sheets. The questions for each program package in a curriculum are

labeled and divided by program package titles. Record your answers to the questions in the column Your Response in the Parent's Questionnaire. Then, have your child answer the questions on the Survey. Record the child's score on the score sheet under Your Child's Score.

- Find the Survey you want on the diskette label and press any key to begin. The following information appears on the screen:
 - A keyboard introduction. (To bypass this step, press the SPACE BAR.)
 - Instructions for using the Parent's Questionnaire.
- Press ENTER to continue to the menu for the Survey Diskette you have selected.

Which Basic Skills Reading test do you want to take?

- Making New Words
- Understanding New Words

Type 1 or 2

Press QUIT to leave.

Next, press the number of your selection.

Choose a program package test for Making New Words.

- Basic Word Building
- 2. More Basic Word Building
- Complex Word Building
- Prefixes, Suffixes, and Compound Words
- More Prefixes and Suffixes
- Prefixes and Suffixes in Context

Press BACK for Reading subjects.

- Have your child proceed with the Survey. When the score screen appears, record your child's score on the Parent's Questionnaire.
- Evaluate the results of the Survey questions and decide which packages your child needs.

Information concerning use and service can be found in your User's Reference Guide and in the manuals packaged with your TI Disk Memory System, Memory Expansion unit, or Peripheral Expansion System.

Caring for the PLATO® Diskette and Cartridge

Keep the diskette and cartridge clean and dry. Place the diskette in its protective cover when not in use, and protect it from bending. Store the diskette in an upright position away from heat, cold, and magnetic sources.

Caution: The contents of a diskette or cartridge can be damaged by static electricity discharges.

Static electricity buildups are more likely to occur when the humidity of the air is low (during winter and in areas with dry climates). To avoid damaging the diskette or cartridge, touch any metal object (a doorknob, a desklamp, etc.) before handling it.

If static electricity is a problem where you live, you may want to buy a special carpet treatment that reduces static buildup. These commercial preparations are usually available from hardware and office supply dealers.

In Case of Difficulty

If the diskette programs do not appear to be operating properly or if the screen message SYSTEMERROR appears, return to the master title screen by pressing QUIT. When the disk drive stops turning and the red light goes out, withdraw the diskette. Press any key to make the PLATO title screen appear. Align the diskette with the opening of the disk drive, and carefully reinsert the diskette. Then, continue as before.

If the programs continue to operate improperly, return to the master title screen by pressing QUIT. Remove the diskette and the PLATO Interpreter cartridge. Next, turn the computer off and check to be sure that the peripherals are properly attached and turned on. If the peripherals are properly turned on, turn the computer on again. Align the cartridge with the cartridge opening and reinsert it. Press any key. Reinsert the diskette in the disk drive and then press ENTER. The diskette program should begin.

If the PLATO Interpreter cartridge is removed from the slot while the courseware is being used, the computer may behave erratically. To restore the computer to normal operation, turn the computer console off and wait a few seconds. Then, reinsert the cartridge and turn the computer on again.

FCTN 9 (BACK)	Returns to information previously presented or to the menu screen.	
FCTN 8 (REDO)	Repeats the information just completed—available only with introduction to the keyboard.	
FCTN 7 (AID)	Provides additional information—available only with introduction to the keyboard.	
ENTER	Continues to the next screen.	
FCTN S	Erases an entry, character by character.	
FCTN =	Returns to the master title	

Note: At the bottom of each screen is a list of the key sequences available for use on that screen. Only those key sequences that appear on a screen are functional except QUIT, which can be used at any time during a program.

The ALPHA LOCK must be in the OFF (up) position when using PLATO courseware.
